Comparison of results

DIFFERENT STUDIES AGREE:

that **the Internet** is the main source of information, and it is considered the most relevant and useful (Kitzie, 2017; Burton & Avilla, 2021)



IN OUR CASE:

the people interviewed established they prefer **social networks** over other information resources to learn about their sexual identity.

FEEL SAFE

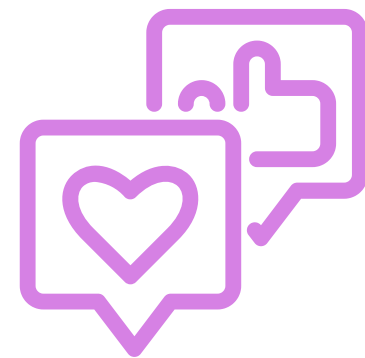

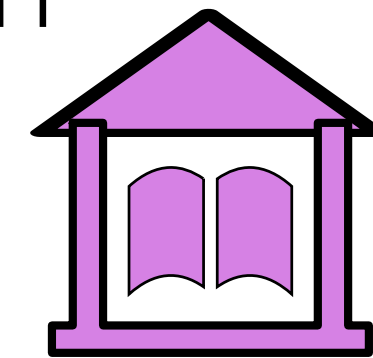
Comparison of results

Our results are in line with previous studies in that:

1. THE INTERNET AND
SOCIAL NETWORKS ARE
WHERE PEOPLE GET THE
MOST INFORMATION



2. THE USE OF LIBRARIES TO
FIND INFORMATION ABOUT
EACH INDIVIDUAL'S SEXUAL
IDENTITY IS ALMOST
INEXISTENT

3. Collective little homogenous

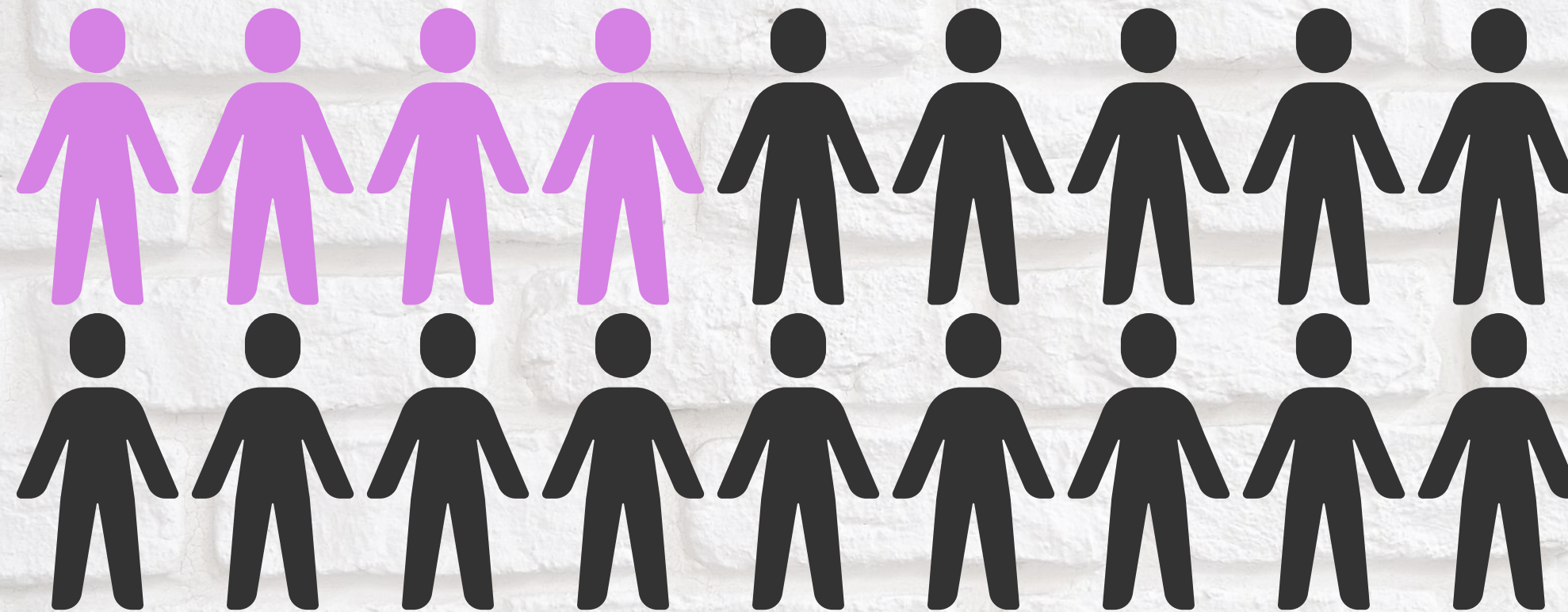


FUTURE RESEARCH

This study opens doors to investigate the informational barriers in the LGBTQ+ community in Spain, since most of the research has been carried out outside our borders, especially in the United States.



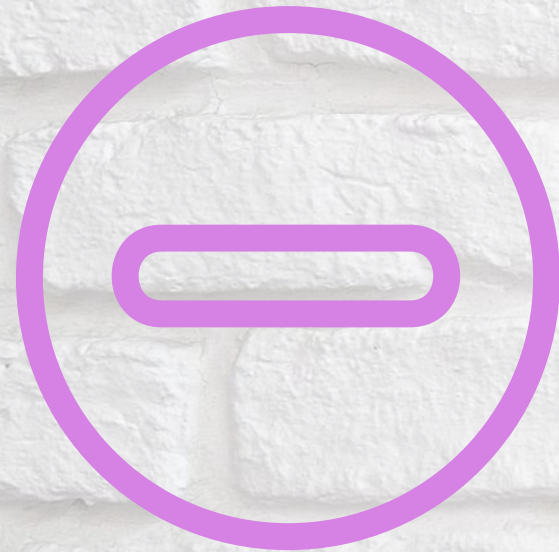
Does the LGBTQ+ community usually find accurate information related to their information needs?



just the 22% of LGBTQ+ participants said that found useful and truthful information through different information resources



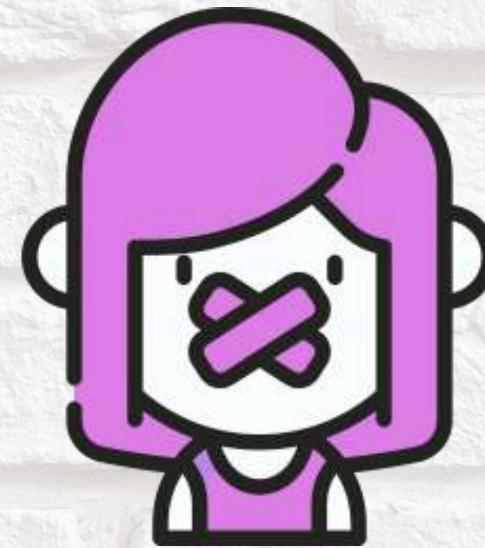
What are their principal limitations when they try to seek information?
