What is Free Open Source Software (FOSS)?

A type of software that allows the user to RUN, COPY, DISTRIBUTE, STUDY, CHANGE AND IMPROVE the software itself. FREEDOMS" SEE **"THE FOUR FUNDAMENTAL** EXPLORED PREVIOUSLY BY COMPUTER SCIENTIST RICHARD **STALLMAN** (FREE SOFTWARE **FOUNDATION**)

FOSS licenses [edit]

FOSS stands for "Free and Open Source Software". There is no one universally agreed-upon definition of FOSS software and various groups maintain approved lists of licenses. The Open Source Initiative (OSI) is one such organization keeping a list of open-source licenses.^[1] The Free Software Foundation (FSF) maintains a list of what it considers free.^[2] FSF's free software and OSI's open-source licenses together are called FOSS licenses. There are licenses accepted by the OSI which are not free as per the Free Software Definition. The Open Source Definition allows for further restrictions like price, type of contribution and origin of the contribution, e.g. the case of the NASA Open Source Agreement, which requires the code to be "original" work.^{[3][4]} The OSI does not endorse FSF license analysis (interpretation) as per their disclaimer.^[5]

The FSF's Free Software Definition focuses on the user's unrestricted rights to use a program, to study and modify it, to copy it, and redistribute it for any purpose, which are considered by the FSF the *four essential freedoms*.^{[6][7]} The OSI's open-source criteria focuses on the availability of the source code and the advantages of an unrestricted and community driven development model.^[8] Yet, many FOSS licenses, like the Apache License, and all Free Software licenses allow commercial use of FOSS components.^[9]

What does "self-hosted" mean?

"Self Hosting is a form of running your own website or application by setting up a server and network yourself. Instead of using a Platform as a Service or a Public Cloud Provider, those who choose to self-host will run their own **networks and be responsible for the maintenance and uptime** in addition to building their website or application."

Is it worth the responsability?

We highlight the following benefits

Reduced costs (vs third-party vendors) and more sustainable

Ethical data control and avoidance of vendor lockin

An **opportunity** to rethink the function of libraries in the digital age and be active and autonomous institutions

Customization of the software and its functionalities to the needs of the **library** user's needs

But there are some challenges we need to adress

Some of them, identified by previous literature

Lack of training for librarians in this field (digital skills)

Institutional policies may not contemplate the use of FOSS

Limited **budget** for the acquisition of hardware and broadband

Reorganize some aspects of the internal structure and set up ethics committees, IT departments...

FOSS in different international initiatives



IFLA

IFLA has produced multiple documents around the SDG's of the **2030 Agenda**. The statement published last October 2022 highlights **the need for accountability in this area**.



UNESCO

Recognises FOSS as a tool to "create, exchange, share and exploit software and knowledge efficiently and effectively". It also recognises its sustainable nature because of its openess and freedom.



Next Generation Internet

The EC has conducted studies which conclude that FOSS is an excellent way to support open standards, interoperability and create communities for knowledge sharing. FOSS as a tool to help libraries accomplish some SDG's










Disappearance of economic gaps between students because of the low or zero cost for licenses.



Empowering girls and women to actively participate in the development of software, reducing the **gender gap in tech**.



The European Commission has identified that this type of software **contributes to an increase of returns on R&D investments.**

BOBCATSSSS 2023 (Oslo, Norway) "Exploring Free Open Source Software projects in libraries" Some authors have identified that FOSS fosters creativity, thus opening up the possibility that libraries could become incubators for FOSS IT projects.

Users are allowed to acquire skills in a software that they can use on their devices **regardless of their economic level** and that uses **open standards**.

The EC Open Source Software Strategy 2020-2023 recognizes FOSS **as a way to make good use of public money**, as well as a way to save it and **increase citizens' trust in public services**.


