- The 1994 WTO Agreements:
  - ✓ GATT 194/94
  - ✓ Technical barriers to trade
  - ✓ Sanitary and phytosanitary measures
  - ✓ Trade in services
  - ✓ Trade-related investment measures
  - ✓ Subsidies and countervailing measures
  - ✓ Agriculture
  - ✓ Intellectual property



- Debate on Article XX GATT:
  - "necessary to protect human, animal or plant life or health"
  - "relating to the conservation of exhaustible natural resources"
  - ✓ "arbitrary or unjustifiable discrimination between countries where the same conditions prevail / disguised restriction on international trade ("least trade-distorting regulation principle")



- Debate on non-product-related PPMs:
  - ✓ General most-favored nation treatment:
  - ✓ National treatment obligation
  - ✓ Prohibition on quantitative restrictions
- "like products": whether likeness should be determined by reference to product's characteristics + non-product-related PPMs by which a product is made
  - ✓ Yes: Discrimination between physically similar products on the basis of environmentally unsound PPM is accepted
  - ✓ No: Discrimination between physically similar products on the basis of environmentally unsound PPM is not accepted



- North-South relations (arguments):
  - To harm developing countries' competitiveness and negatively affect their exports
  - ✓ To force developing countries to buy modern technologies from the North
  - ✓ New form of protectionism by developed countries to protect their market from the cheaper products from the developing countries
  - ✓ To question environmental and social legitimacy of the developed countries' arguments
  - ✓ Trade measures are inherently unfair, as they can only be used by the economically powerful against the economically weak

- Damage to environment and enjoyment of human rights :
  - ✓ Poverty, underdevelopment
  - ✓ Climate change
  - ✓ Deforestation, tree felling
  - ✓ Biological diversity
  - ✓ Pollution, dumping of toxic and hazardous products and substances



- Violation of human rights and damage to environment:
  - ✓ Right to development
  - ✓ Right to self-determination
  - Right to public participation through democratic processes
  - ✓ Right to fair and suitable procedure / due process
  - ✓ Right to work with fair and suitable conditions
  - ✓ Right to information free access
  - ✓ Right to association and free expression
